Over the past 4 weeks, grade 5 and 6 have been learning about their health, wellbeing and stages of growing up.

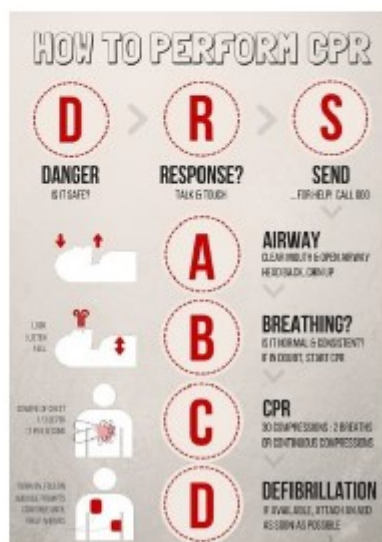
This week they revised DRSABCD and practiced their skills using dummies. They learnt the importance of basic first aid and how to look after one another in case of an emergency.

I Sea I Care

On Tuesday the 12th of March Justine, Taliah, Isabella and Ms Wheatley drove to Moorabbin Primary School to attend a sustainability program called "I Sea I Care."

We participated in three activities the first one was to learn about marine animal species like the Australian Fur Seal, the 11 Armed Seastar, the Northern Pacific Seastar, the Decorator Crab and the Port Jackson Shark. We learnt about these animals because they are all interesting assets to the marine life around Australia.

The next activity was all about the things you can find on Australian beaches such as a holdfast, a sea sponge, a shell that had a hole in it, and a plastic bottle.

The last activity was about how much rubbish there is in the ocean, so it's hard for dolphins to find food to eat.

Then, we practised presenting the same activities to each other, so after that we ran the activities with a Grade 1/2 class at the school.

We learnt it's really important to recycle and to keep our ocean clean. We also learnt how to present to younger students.

Since then we have spread the word by showing the younger students at our school the same activities. We have shown 12A, 12B and 12C. We're also hoping to run a fundraiser for the Dolphin Research Institute.





The new program has been designed in two parts:

- **Science and Technology:**
Students explore the world of powered mechanisms and simple machines.
- **Creativity and imagination:**
Students engage with LEGO® pieces to complete puzzles, games and challenges without instructions and become Master Builders!

The course is designed for all primary aged students with each student using an age appropriate LEGO® Education kit to complete his or her challenge.

As long serving primary school teachers we believe it is important to use the Australian Curriculum as a guideline to the program.

Key STEM Learning Values:

- **Physical Science:** The way objects move depends on a variety of factors including their size and shape: a push or a pull affects how an object moves or changes shape
- **Engineering Principles and systems:** Explore how technologies use forces to create movement in designed solutions
- **Materials and technologies specialisations:** Explore the characteristics and properties of materials and components that are used to create designed solutions

The 9 week course will begin in term 2, on Thursday the 2nd of May, lunchtime, at a cost of \$150 per student. The course will be held at Kingston Heath Primary School (hall)

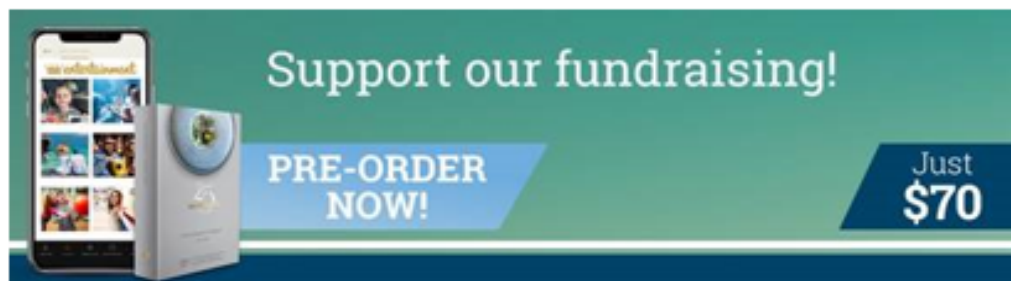
