The Leader Local Grant project leads me to the first of many successes and other reasons to celebrate at Kingston Heath Primary School, including;

Celebrations

- You may have seen yesterday's Facebook post on the Official Kingston Heath Primary School Facebook page. Because of the strong community support for the 'Update our Kitchen' project, we received enough votes to be declared the WINNER of the Moorabbin Leader *Leader Local Grants* program. We were awarded a grant of \$1,000.00 that will be used toward updating equipment and tools in our kitchen. Congratulations, Kingston Heath Primary School Community!
- Student results from our recent Attitudes to School Survey have arrived - and we have much to celebrate and also some lines of inquiry. According to our year 4 to year 6 students, our teachers and our school have improved across every measure, in some cases quite substantially. A few worth mentioning are that:
 - ◇ 83% (up from 68% in 2018) of our students in years 4 to 6 Agree or Strongly Agree they have the capacity and support to undertake challenging work at school (Learning Confidence)
 - ◇ 85% (up from 65% in 2018) Agree or Strongly Agree they feel safe at school and know how to access help if they need it (Bullying)
 - ◇ 89% (up from 77%) Agree or Strongly Agree that their teachers understand how they learn and support their learning (Differentiated Learning)
 - ◇ 77% (up from 58% in 2018) Agree or Strongly Agree they are encouraged to and participate in school and classroom decision making (Student Voice)
 - ◇ 92% (up from 80% in 2018) Agree or Strongly Agree that they have friends at school and the teachers here create inclusive environments (Inclusion).
- Book Week is just around the corner - Week 6, 17 - 23 August 2019. Our Literacy Action Team have planned a Book Week parade and other engaging activities to celebrate this week's theme, *Reading is My Secret Power*. Details can be found on COMPASS in a post from the Literacy Team.

Many of the sub-committees are still seeking 3-5 new members. If you are interested, please watch for the information to be posted again on COMPASS next week.
- School Production: Lock it in your calendar! The school production is not far away now - Tuesday 10 September 2019.
- It is wonderful to see so many students and siblings walking their bikes and scooters inside the school gates. It shows respect and concern for the safety of everyone in our community, and we would like to remind all of our cyclists and scooter-riders to do the same.

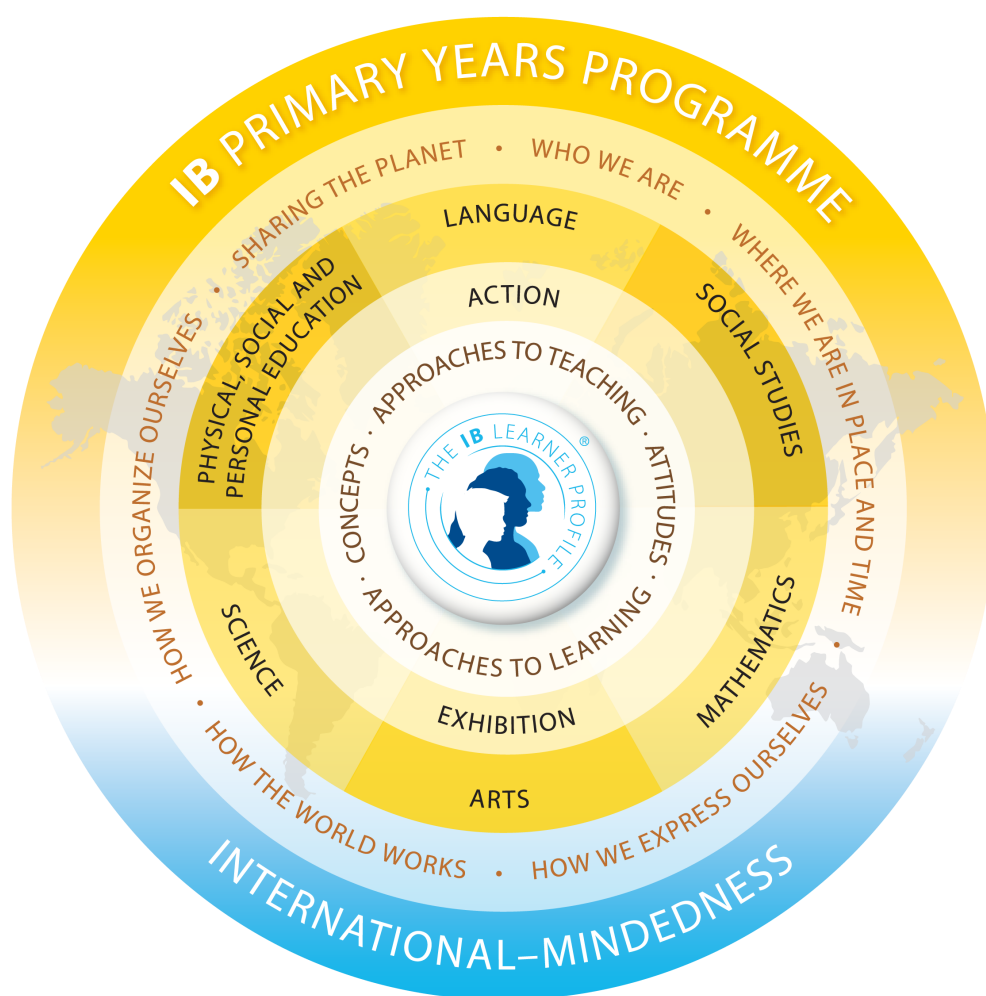

Welcome to the PYP Corner! In this section you will be updated on any PYP related topics, student action, answers to PYP questions, etc.

The PYP Curriculum Model

The curriculum in the PYP includes what is to be learned (the written curriculum), how it is to be learned (the taught curriculum) and how it is to be assessed (the learned curriculum).

At the heart of the PYP philosophy is a commitment to structured **inquiry** as the leading vehicle for learning. Six trans-disciplinary **themes** provide the framework for the exploration of knowledge. Teachers and students are guided by these themes as they design curricular units for exploration and study. These **units of inquiry** make up the KHPS **Programme of Inquiry (POI)**. Students explore subject areas through these themes. In the process, they develop an understanding of important **concepts**, acquire essential **skills** and **knowledge**, develop particular **learner profile attributes** and learn to take socially responsible **action**.

- Mural



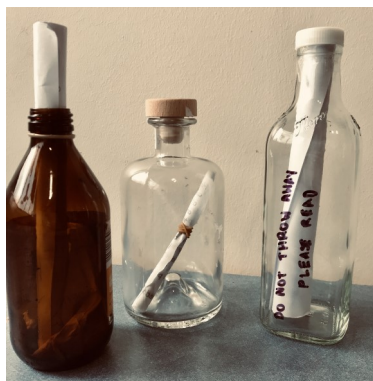
The students show enthusiasm and an open-mind to learning new skills during the electives. One of the highlights of our week!

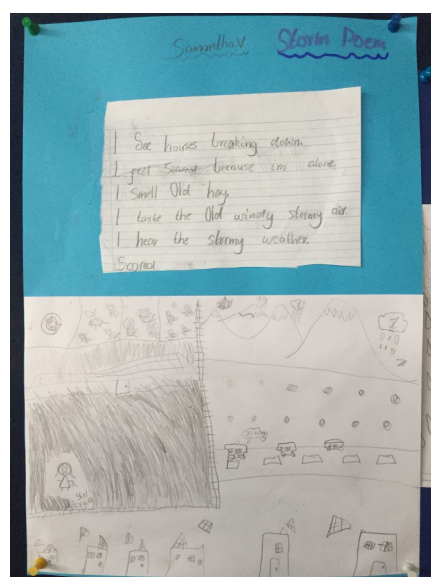
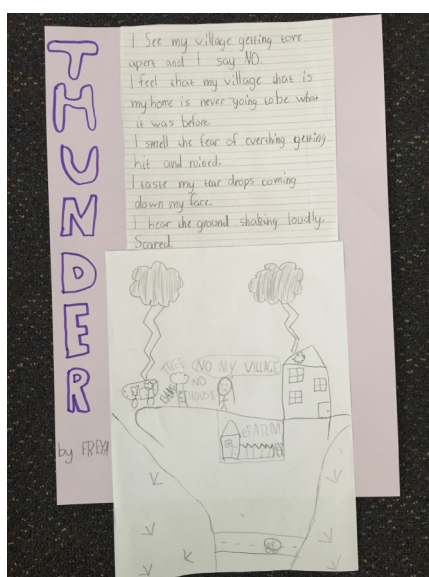
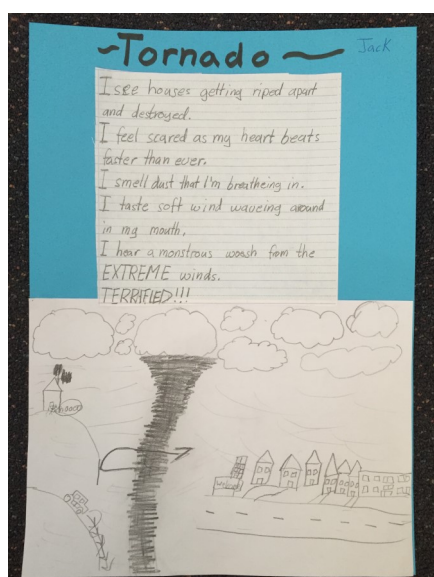

How The World Works

This week during a English/Unit of Inquiry lesson grade 3/4 students were required to visualise what it might be like to be caught in a storm. After hearing a text about the storm, students drew a picture and wrote a poem that depicted the emotions and senses they might be feeling and put the two together to create a poster.



Paul Jennings/PJ Day

On Wednesday grades 3 and 4 spent the day learning about the author Paul Jennings. This included reading a short story titled 'Skeleton on the Dunny' then watching an episode of Round The Twist that used the same short story. Students then created a Venn Diagram that showed the similarities and differences between the two. As some added fun for the day, students dressed in their PJs to celebrate our Paul Jennings day.



Maths Rotations

During our week three maths lessons, students worked on a multi part activity that required them to design their own hotel/resort and think about what they needed to have in each room (e.g. bedding, bathroom items and kitchen items). Students then used the information they had to calculate what it would cost to set up each part of their resort and find a total price for everything they needed. Students really enjoyed working together to solve the problems that were presented to them and used a range of skills we have been regularly practicing, particularly the four operations.

STUDENT AGENCY

All students have been engaging in Mem Fox texts this term and have been able to select a book of their choice to present to their class. It was fantastic to see students increasing their confidence when presenting and taking ownership of their work. Their attention as an audience member was also important during this task. Well done!

LEARNER PROFILE ATTRIBUTE

This week we have been embracing the Learner Profile Attribute of being an **Inquirer**. Students have been exploring different natural forces this week and have been busy testing and trialling different outcomes. Many students are using their prior knowledge on topics to test hypotheses and then synthesising their new knowledge to modify experiments and results. This was evident during our domino and magnet maze experiments in the week!



Incursion Fun

We had an awesome Incursion, 'Mad about Science', where the students gained a wealth of knowledge about natural forces, witnessing some amazing experiments and objects. Students were also fortunate enough to have two lovely parent speakers, Rebecca Wilton and Matthew Harman, who discussed different forces with students. Students were able to see some awesome domino skills from Rebecca, and learnt how to construct different domino runs, and how they can collapse using push and pull! Matthew informed students about how massive ships stay afloat in the water, even when they are incredibly heavy! We learned some amazing new facts and learned how displacement occurs!

Level 5/6: Saturday 7th December

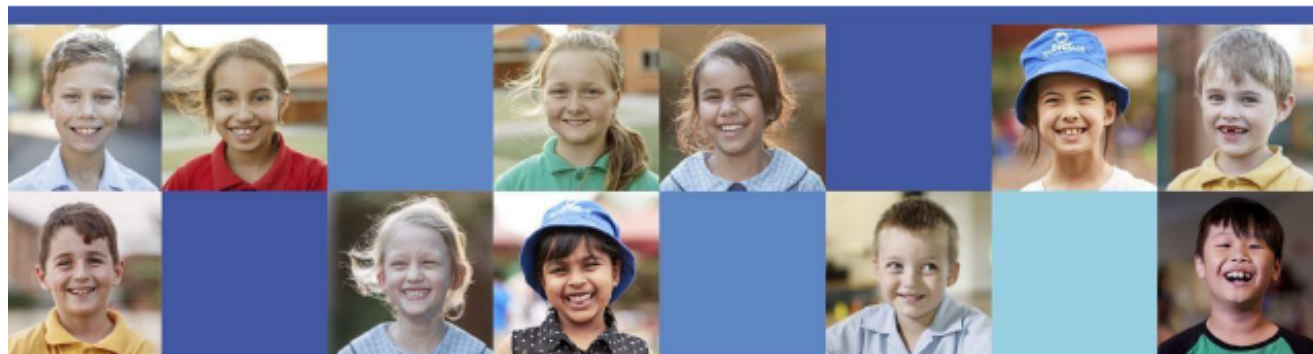

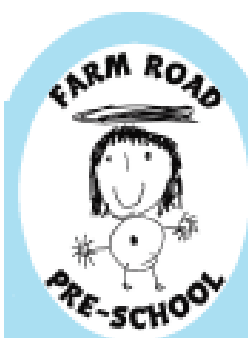
