Dear KHPS Families;

Every year across the country schools celebrate the joy and importance of reading through the CBCA (Children's Book Council of Australia) Book Week. Last week we celebrated Book Week's 2019 theme, *Reading Is My Secret Power*, and reading is truly a secret power: it takes us to other communities and fantasy worlds, supports us to acquire new knowledge, enhances your vocabulary and expression, and can affirm who we are. You may already be aware of the CBCA's website, Reading Time (<a href="http://readingtime.com.au">http://readingtime.com.au</a>), which reviews a wide range of fiction and non-fiction books for all ages from early childhood to adulthood.

Another very useful resource for families is an article published in The Conversation, *Six things you should do when reading with your kids* <a href="http://theconversation.com/six-things-you-should-do-when-reading-with-your-kids-99637">http://theconversation.com/six-things-you-should-do-when-reading-with-your-kids-99637</a>. This article contains simple yet powerful evidence-based tips for reading *with* your child, an important strategy at school and at home from early childhood and even after a child becomes an independent reader.

## Transdisciplinary Themes

One of the most significant and distinctive feature of the IB Primary Years Programme is the six Transdisciplinary Themes.

These themes are about issues that have meaning for, and are important to, all of us. The programme offers a balance between learning about or through the subject areas, and learning beyond them. The six themes of global significance create a Transdisciplinary framework that allows students to "step up" beyond the confines of learning within subject areas. The programme focuses on the development of the whole child as an inquirer, both in the classroom and in the world outside.

- Who we are
- Where we are in place and time
- How we express ourselves
- How the world works
- How we organize ourselves
- Sharing the planet

The **six transdisciplinary themes** help teachers to develop a programme of inquiry that allow for in-depth investigations into important ideas and requiring a high level of involvement on the part of the students. These inquiries are substantial, authentic and usually last for several weeks.

Please don't forget to ask your child's class teacher what they are inquiring into next.






