These will be organised in different ways at different year levels and we will communicate this with you early next year. Every Victorian Curriculum learning area will continue to be taught at every year level, as guided by the Victorian Curriculum.

At the end of every school year, we find ourselves in the unenviable position of needing to say farewell to members of our community, including some staff. We would like to take this opportunity to thank the following staff for their commitment and service to our school: **Amy Jones (Foundation)**, **Andrea Smith (Year 3/4)**, **Chris O'Connor (PE)**, **Samantha May (ES Library)** and **Charlotte Birbeck (Year 5/6)**. Each of these members of our team have left their mark on Kingston Heath Primary School and will be missed by students, families and colleagues alike.


Gingerbread Making

We also prepare students for AMEB and ANZCA music exam grading.


Once Students are competent with playing a few chords and notes Rock Bands will commence and rehearse weekly at lunchtimes and afterschool.




