

EXCURSION POLICY

1. Rationale:

1.1 The school's excursion program enables students to further their learning and social development in a non-school setting. Excursions complement, and are an important aspect of the educational programs offered at our school.

2. Aims:

- 2.1 To reinforce, complement and extend learning opportunities beyond the classroom.
- 2.2 To develop an understanding that learning is not limited to school, and that valuable and powerful learning takes place in the real world.

3. Implementation:

- 3.1 An excursion is defined as any teaching or learning activity outside the school grounds.
- 3.2 School Council must approve all excursions. In doing so, School Council will determine a schedule of excursions for the school year, will ensure that all excursions are maintained at a reasonable and affordable cost, and comply with all DET requirements.
- 3.3 The schedule of excursions, including costs, will be made available to parents as early as reasonably practicable in each year.
- 3.4 Parents are to be provided with an opportunity to sign over their "CSEF" payment if applicable. All endeavours will be made not to exclude students simply for financial reasons. Parents experiencing financial difficulty, who wish for their children to attend an excursion, will be required to discuss their individual situation with the Principal. Decisions relating to alternative payment arrangements will be made by the Principal on a case-by-case basis. All families will be given sufficient time to make payments for excursions. Parents will be sent notices before the excursion date reminding them of the need to finalise payment. Children whose payments have not been finalised at least 24 hours before the departure date will not be allowed to attend unless alternative payment arrangements had been previously organised with the Principal.
- 3.5 Office staff will be responsible for managing and monitoring the payments made by parents and will provide classroom teachers with detailed records on a regular basis.
- 3.6 A designated 'Teacher in Charge' will coordinate each excursion.
- 3.7 Prior to any child attending an excursion, parents/guardians must have provided to the school permission for their child to attend and must have paid the costs involved unless otherwise approved by the Principal.
- 3.8 Information will be provided to all parents of non-English speaking families in a manner that allows them to provide an informed consent to their children attending excursions.
- 3.9 The designated Teacher in Charge of each excursion will ensure that all excursions, transport arrangements and excursion activities comply with DET guidelines. The

“Notification of School Activity” form will be completed and forwarded to the DET (if required) by three weeks prior to the excursion departure date.

- 3.10 Classroom teachers will be given the first option to attend excursions.
- 3.11 A first-aid kit and relevant individual medical medicines will be taken on all excursions.
- 3.12 Copies of completed Permission advice must be carried by excursion staff at all times.
- 3.13 A senior staff member will be in attendance at school whilst the children are returning from any out-of-school-hours excursion. The Teacher in Charge will communicate with this person with regards to the anticipated return time.
- 3.14 Parents of children involved in excursions may be invited to assist in the delivery of excursions. When deciding on which parents will attend, the Teacher in Charge will take into account –
 - Any valuable skills the parents have to offer. Eg. bus licence, first aid etc
 - The need to include both male and female parents.
 - The special needs of particular students.
 - A current Working With Children Check
- 3.15 Only children who have displayed sensible, reliable behaviour at school will be invited to participate in school excursions. Parents will be notified if a child is in danger of losing their invitation to participate in an excursion due to poor behaviour at school. The decision to exclude a student will be made by the Principal, in consultation with the classroom teacher and the Teacher in Charge.

4. Evaluation:

- 4.1 This policy will be reviewed as part of the school’s three-year review cycle. Ratified by School Council on 15 November 2017.
